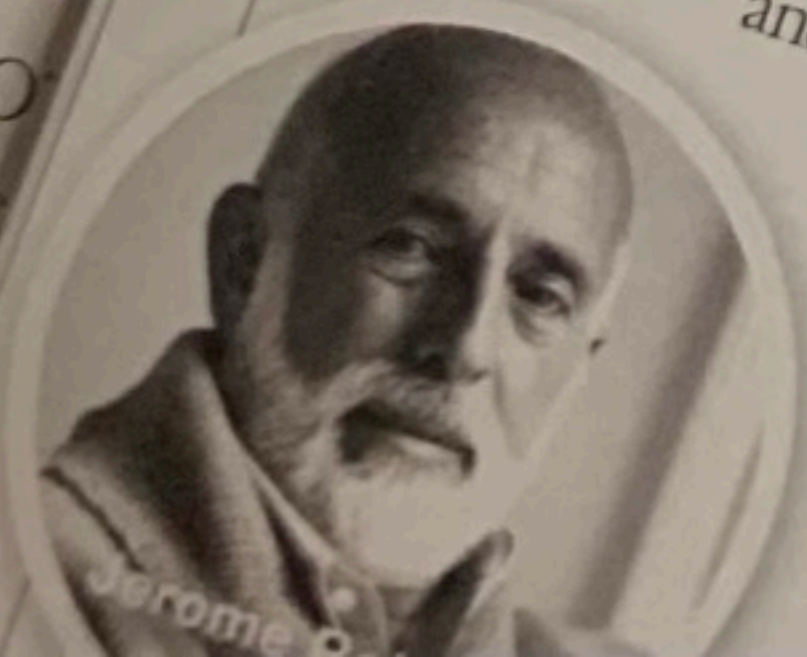
HIDEAWAY HAMLETS
